Superintendent Minister's Letter:

Dear Friends,

This month marks the start of the Methodist Connexional New Year. We would normally be very busy preparing to go to Synod, circuit meetings, harvest festivals and church council meetings. What a very different autumn now lies ahead of us full of Zoom meetings and socially distanced worship services.

In my summer article, I likened plans to return to worship to the ministry post exilic prophet Haggai as the people of Israel returned to their promised land. In his Pastoral message for the Methodist New Year, the President of Conference, Revd. Richard Teal draws parallels with another post exilic Prophet, Nehemiah. He says that 'We tend to think of Nehemiah as a man full of activity and action. Remember how he amazingly rebuilt the walls of Jerusalem. When he arrived in the city, he didn't start work immediately because he did not know where to begin. He didn't organise people straight away to start work on this huge building project. He stopped, observed and listened and only then did he know what to do and the rebuilding restarted.'

Is this where we are as a circuit at the moment as we return to worship in our churches? Many of us feel very unsure and uncertain as we take this next tentative step of faith. There is a temptation for us to feel we have to be immediately hyper actively full of life and action. Do we, like Nehemiah need to spend time listening, thinking and praying before we take on any new and bold projects? Listening to the Spirit of God is not about being lazy, passive or inactive. It is learning to think with the mind of Christ.

Inevitably, the Covid 19 pandemic will continue to influence what we can and can't do this autumn. But it need not all be fear, doom and gloom. The pandemic has forced us all to reconsider the ways in which we are church. Our on-line services, for example, have been a great success and brought us in contact with many new people.

So may we all use these next few weeks carefully as an opportunity to discern the mind of Christ and move forward in our ministry with confidence and with purpose.

Update 10 September

The Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government last night provided us with further clarification on the Government announcement this week of changes to permitted social interaction which come into place on **Monday 14 September in England**. We understand that the full regulations will be published later this week and we will update our guidance accordingly.

In summary:

Places of Worship can **remain open** for services and prayer. As before, the limit on the number of people is determined by the risk assessment with attendees divided into multiple groups of no more than 6 people.

Weddings and funerals are **still allowed** and maximum numbers remain at 30 with people divided into multiple groups of no more than 6.

Community Halls remain open and activities are allowed as before but within each activity, participants can be in groups that consist of no more than 6 people.

The government has emphasised that venues must be Covid-19 secure and contact details must be left for Test and Trace. More information can be read

Bible reading, from 1 Corinthians 13

Lesley Murray included this in her recent service at Sunfields. It is well worth a second publication! This version is taken from the 're-written for times of a pandemic' Bible (not quite as well known a version as the King James translation but apt for today):

We can have all the best technology, fantastic preachers and music that doesn't lag or jump but if we don't love we're nothing but electronic feedback or an un-muted attempt at singing on Zoom. We can talk all the good sense in the world, know all the risks and have faith enough that God will help us cope with this virus, but if we don't love, we've got nothing. We can spend our days shopping for others, and our nights on the phone to the lonely and isolated until we're run ragged and exhausted. But if we don't love, we've got nowhere.

Love waits patiently two metres away in the supermarket, love is kind to those who feel forgotten, it does not envy the furloughed or take pride in its status as a 'key worker', it doesn't blame others for the virus's spread or seek to make money from other people's misfortune. It doesn't get angry at its rights being taken away nor does it keep records of its neighbours breaking lockdown. Love does not delight in our leaders failings though it rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.

Love never fails. This virus may mutate, this virus or die. Church will change – as it has before and will do again. Scientific knowledge will move on, leaving what we have now in the dust. For now we may only see in part but that doesn't mean we have a partial gospel and one day we shall see the full picture. Before this pandemic, most of us knew nothing of R-rates, social distancing and lockdown, now we know better and have put our past understandings behind us. For now we see but through a screen darkly, then we will see face-to-face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known.

And now these three remain: faith, hope and love.

But the greatest of these is love.
